This contract covers the construction and completion of heating contract for remodeling and furnishing old chapel, fourth floor of main building, Longview State Hospital, Cincinnati, Ohio, and calls for an expenditure of one thousand six hundred and twenty-nine dollars (\$1,629.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. In addition you have submitted a contract bond, upon which Ida J. Miller and Grace Miller Todd appear as sureties, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.
