ABSTRACT, STATUS OF TITLE, PREMISES SITUATED IN COUNTY OF

GENTLEMEN:—You have submitted an Abstract certified to by Emmett Keenan, July 17, 1923, and requested my opinion as to the status of the title of the following described premises as disclosed by said Abstract:

“Situated in the County of Athens, in the State of Ohio, and in the City of Athens and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the south-east corner of Out Lot No. 203 in E. H. and D. H. Moore's Addition to Athens and running thence West, on the North line of Union Street two hundred and thirty-five feet; thence Northward to a point on the North line of Out Lot No. 205 of said Addition, 235 feet Westward from the West line of Out Lot No. 201 in said Addition; thence eastward on the North line of said Lot No. 205, two hundred and thirty-five feet to the West line of Lot No. 201; thence South on said West line of Lot 201 to the place of beginning.”

After an examination, it is the opinion of this department that said Abstract discloses a sufficient title to said premises in the name of Sarah J. Parker, free from encumbrances, excepting the taxes for the year 1923, and certain assessments for the improvement of Union Street, the amounts of which have not been determined, or are not disclosed.
