DEAR SIR:—You have submitted two bonds, each in the penal sum of \$5,000.00, with sureties as indicated, to cover the faithful performance of the duties of the officials as hereinafter listed:

American Surety Company of New York.

Lyle B. McBride—Resident District Deputy Director in Trumbull
County—Massachusetts Bonding and Insurance Company.

These bonds are undoubtedly executed pursuant to the provisions of Sections 1183 and 1182-3, General Code, which provide, in so far as pertinent:

“Section 1183, General Code.

* * * Such resident district deputy directors shall * * * give bond in the sum of five thousand dollars. * * *”

“Section 1182-3, General Code.

* * * All bonds hereinbefore provided for shall be conditioned upon the faithful discharge of the duties of their respective positions, and such bonds * * * shall be approved as to sufficiency of the sureties by the director (of highways), and as to legality and form by the attorney general, and be deposited with the secretary of state. * * *”

(Words in parenthesis the writer's.)
