

Arthur Keith – Redactions made to documents:

- **Social Security number (SSN) redacted.** The release of social security numbers is prohibited by state and federal law. 5 U.S.C. § 522(a); *State ex rel. Beacon Journal Publ'g v. City of Akron*, 70 Ohio St.3d 605, 607 (1994-Ohio-6). Therefore, all Social Security numbers have been redacted from the reports.
- **Driver's license numbers redacted.** Driver's license numbers are considered personal information, exempt from disclosure, pursuant to R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(c), and are further protected from disclosure by the Driver's Privacy Protection Act of 1994. 18 U.S.C. § 2741.
- **Law Enforcement and EMS personnel's residential information redacted.** Residential and familial information of Law Enforcement and EMS personnel (including residential phone numbers) is not public record pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(7)(f).
- **Information and photos obtained from the Ohio Law Enforcement Gateway (OHLEG) database redacted.** Information and photos obtained from OHLEG is not a public record pursuant to 109.57(D)(1)(b).
- **Records from ATF Trace Reports redacted.** Records from ATF Trace Reports are not public records. Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2005, Pub. L. No. 108-477, 118 Stat. 2809, 2859 (2004); Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2008, Pub. L. No. 110-161, 121 Stat. 2859 (2004); *Higgins v. U.S. Dept. of Justice*, 919 F. Supp.2d 131, 144-45 (D.D.C. 2013).
- **NIBIN documents withheld** under R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(v).
- **Autopsy photographs redacted/withheld.** Autopsy photos of the decedent are not public records. R.C. 313.10(D). A journalist requester may request to inspect these records, but cannot copy or take notes regarding them.
- **Attorney work product withheld.** Ohio Civ.R. 26(B)(3) protects material in anticipation of litigation or for trial. This civil rule protects the “notes or documents containing the mental impressions, conclusions, opinions, or legal theories of its attorney or other representative concerning the litigation.” *Squire, Sanders & Dempsey, LLP v. Givaudan Flavors Corp.*, 127 Ohio St.3d 161, 2010-Ohio-4469, ¶55.
- **Grand jury records removed.** Ohio Criminal Rule 6(E) forbids the release of matters appearing before the grand jury.
- **Information of juvenile witnesses withheld.** R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(h) as having a high probability of disclosing information that would endanger the life or physical safety of a witness.
