Officer Involved Critical Incident - Interstate 270 Northbound on Big Walnut Creek Bridge, Columbus (L)

Investigative Activity: Collection of Autopsy Evidence (Scene #3)  
Activity Date: March 25, 2021  
Activity Location: Franklin County Coroner's Office and BCI Headquarters, London, OH

On March 25, 2021, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Chad Holcomb was informed by Franklin County Coroner's Office (FCCO) Investigations Supervisor Kate Yoder that evidence from the Andrew Teague (Teague) autopsy was ready for pickup. Teague was shot and killed during an officer involved critical incident that occurred on March 5, 2021 (*see report: Processing of I-270 Northbound*).

SA Holcomb took custody of the evidence from the FCCO at 1158 hours and transported the evidence to the BCI offices in London, Ohio. The following evidence was photographed, packaged and labeled:

- Item #1: A projectile recovered from the nasopharynx and a projectile recovered from the neck of Teague
- Item #2: Black Nike zip-up sweatshirt with suspected blood and suspected bullet holes
- Item #3: White Hanes T-Shift with suspected blood and suspected bullet holes
- Item #4: White undershirt with suspected blood and suspected bullet holes
- Item #5: Pair of Nike shoes
- Item #6: Black Nike sweatpants with a suspected bullet hole
- Item #7: Underwear, black socks and a knee brace
- Item #8: Bags from the hands of Teague
- Item #9: Fingerprints and a fingernail kit from the autopsy of Teague
- Item #10: Pair of handcuffs recovered from autopsy
- Item #11: Blood card of Andrew Teague

SA Holcomb was also given a copy of photos taken by the FCCO Investigator Eric Miller at the scene and the photos taken during autopsy. The photos will be uploaded to the Matrix case file.

At 1340 hours, SA Holcomb submitted Item #1 to the BCI Laboratory.

At 1346 hours, SA Holcomb placed Items #2-11 in the BCI temporary evidence locker to be submitted to the BCI evidence vault.
