APPROVAL, ABSTRACT, PREMISES SITUATED IN FRANKLIN COUNTY,

DEAR SIR:—You have recently submitted an abstract, which was last continued September 29, 1920, by J. G. Westwater, attorney, and requested my written opinion as to the status of the title to the following described premises, as disclosed by said abstract:

Situated in the county of Franklin, state of Ohio, and in the city of Columbus, and being lots numbers seventeen (17) and eighteen (18) in R. P. Woodruff's subdivision of the south half of the south half of lot number two hundred and seventy-eight (278) in R. P. Woodruff's Agricultural College Addition to the city of Columbus, Ohio, as the same is numbered and delineated upon the recorded plat thereof, of record in Plat Book 3, page 421, Recorder's Office, Franklin county, Ohio.

After a careful examination it is my opinion that said abstract, with the continuations thereto, discloses the title to said premises to be in the name of George E. Conrard, on September 29, 1920, the date of the last continuation, subject to the incumbrances hereinafter noted.

The taxes for the years 1918 and 1919 amounting to \$8.98, bearing eight per cent interest to date of payment, including eighty cents auditor's fee, are unpaid and a lien against lot number eighteen (18) above described. The taxes for the year 1920 against both lots numbers seventeen (17) and eighteen (18), as above described, are unpaid and a lien.

The abstract discloses that no examination was made in any of the United States courts or in the office of the United States marshal.
