DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works, and the E. M. Carmell Company of Columbus, Ohio. This contract covers the construction of Steam and Hot Water Return Conduits from Capital and Wall Streets to the Basement of the Wyandotte Building, Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the form of proposal dated October 28, 1933. Said contract calls for an expenditure of thirty five hundred and forty dollars (\$3540.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also submitted a certificate of the Controlling Board showing that such board has permitted the advertisement for bids to be published once as authorized by section 7 of House Bill No. 699 of the 90th General Assembly appropriating funds for this improvement. Also it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the Workmen's Compensation have been complied with.
