Dear Sir:—

You have submitted a certificate of title covering 7.219 acres of land, more or less, situated in the Village of Rocky River, Rockport Township, Cuyahoga County, Ohio, which is more particularly described in the certificate.

It is understood that the city of Lakewood is donating said premises to the State of Ohio for armory purposes. According to the certificate the city of Lakewood has a good title to said premises, free from encumbrances, excepting the taxes for the year 1924 which are unpaid and are a lien.

There has also been submitted a deed executed by the mayor and clerk on behalf of the city of Lakewood, which it is believed is sufficient to convey said premises to the State. It is noted, however, that under the terms of the deed, in the event the premises or any buildings erected thereon by the State of Ohio to be used for state purposes are abandoned by the State of Ohio, then the premises revert to the city of Lakewood. However, according to such terms in such event, provision is made for the State realizing upon the buildings that have been erected thereon by the State.
