DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works, for the Department of Public Welfare, and the Lawrence Electric Company of Zanesville, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of Contract for Electrical Work for a project known as Cottage, Massillon State Hospital, Massillon, Ohio, in accordance with Item No. 4 of the form of proposal dated August 24, 1935. Said contract calls for an expenditure of three thousand seven hundred and seventy-three dollars (\$3,773.00).
