CONTRACT—STATE WITH THE FOGARTY ELECTRIC COM-PANY, ELECTRICAL WORK, WOMEN'S DORMITORY, MIAMI UNIVERSITY. OXFORD.

Hon. Carl G. Wahl, Director, Department of Public Works, Columbus, Ohio.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my examination and approval a contract between The State of Ohio acting through you as Director of the Department of Public Works for the Board of Trustees of Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, and The Fogarty Electric Company of Cincinnati, Ohio, for the construction and completion of Contract for Electrical Work for a project known as Women's Dormitory—Unit No. 2, Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, as set forth in Item 4, Electrical Contract for Women's Dormitory—Unit No. 2, of the Form of Proposal dated October 9, 1939, all according to Plans and Specifications, which Plans, Specifications and Proposal are made a part of this Contract. Finding said contract in proper legal form, I have noted my approval thereon, and same is transmitted herewith to you, together with all other papers submitted in this connection.
