APPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN STATE OF OHIO AND R. BURTON CHILD, FINDLAY, OHIO, FOR CONSTRUCTION OF COTTAGE "S", OHIO HOSPITAL FOR EPILEPTICS, GALLIPOLIS, OHIO, AT AN EXPENDITURE OF \$99,912.00—SURETY BOND EXECUTED BY THE HARTFORD ACCIDENT AND INDEMNITY COMPANY.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works, for and on behalf of the Department of Public Welfare (Ohio Hospital for Epileptics), and R. Burton Child, of Findlay, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of the general contract (exclusive of plumbing and heating and electrical work) on a building known as Cottage "S", Ohio Hospital for Epileptics, Gallipolis, Ohio, and alternates G-1, G-2, G-3, G-5, G-7 and G-9, as set forth in the form of proposal dated March 6, 1930. Said contract calls for an expenditure of ninety-nine thousand, nine hundred and twelve dollars (\$99,912.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance, to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also submitted evidence that the Controlling Board has properly consented to and approved the expenditure of the moneys appropriated by the 88th General Assembly, for the purpose covered by this contract, in accordance with Section 11 of House Bill No. 510 of the 88th General Assembly. In addition, you have submitted a contract bond upon which the Hartford Accident and Indemnity Company appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly pre-

pared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the Workmen's Compensation Act have been complied with.
